To The Editor

Dear TRAVELER:

You may recall that Mrs. Levensaler and I called at the factory June 10, 1977 and were offered a tour of the plant. This was a most enlightening experience for us for which we thank you.

We had decided to return to Palm Desert via the "Sonora Pass", a route we had not been over for approximately 18 years. We had not remembered it as being unusually steep. For your information the "Sonora Pass" takes one from the west side of the Sierra's to the east side and connects with highway 395 between Reno and Los Angeles.

We now come to the testimonial!!!

On the evening of August 16, a Tuesday, we passed through the village of Sonora, California, where a sign read, "Sonora Pass", and indicating that it was some 50 miles or so over winding mountain roads due east. "Caution — NO TRAILERS allowed to cross this pass", another sign read. We camped high in the Sierra's that night and arrived at Kennedy Meadows resort and pack station at about 10 o'clock on the morning of the 17th.

At this point we questioned a truck driver of a big rig for directions over the pass to intersect with highway 395 at Bridgeport. The trucker took a careful look at our "Parlor Car", (GMC Motorhome to you), shook his head, then pointed "that-a-way." People gathered around us and likewise shook their heads.

And so we were faced with the alternative of driving the 60 miles or so back to Sonora and then some additional 100 miles or so to our home in Palm Desert.

Let me assure you, there was considerable analysis of the pro's and con's of attempting this crossing and, I might add, there was consideration given to the approach of the tail-end of "Hurricane Doreen" whose winds could hit us at the summit. (As a matter of fact, we did catch it but were safely down in the desert by then.)

The signs read "NO TRAILERS beyond this point".

We decided to try it because we knew we weren't a trailer. There was no chance to make a run at it as the pass climbs steadily from Kennedy Meadows. And there is no turning back once started. If stuck — one would be in the hands of the gods. We started to climb — in low gear — and within minutes our speed dropped to 2 (repeat 2 — two) miles per hour. Fortunately, there were no cars coming down the pass. In places the only way this magnificent vehicle continued to perform was because we "talked" to it, and even then we only succeeded by twisting and turning the wheels viciously and praying.

It is not enough to say "we made it". The eastern descent was equally as steep and was negotiated only by several brake stops and by traveling very, very S-l-o-w-l-y.

Last month, in an attempt to rate your technical and operational maintenance knowledge, our column took the form of a multiple-choice test. We gave you 10 questions and, beneath each question, 4 choices for the correct answer; — A, B, C and/or D. Here, once again, are the questions and, this time, the correct answers. Check your score.

1. Recommended engine oil change interval is?

A. 3 Months/3,000 Miles

Oil does not wear out, but it does become dirty, diluted by crank-case acids and most importantly, the additives break down. Oil is cheap compared to any engine repair.

2. The vehicle engine oil filter should be changed every?

A. 6 Months/6,000 Miles

3. The transmission oil and filter should be changed at what interval?

B. 12 Months/12,000 Miles

Transmission fluid contains many additives which tend to gradually wear out due to heat and contamination. This is the most overlooked maintenance item, and potentially, the most expensive repair. It is vital that the transmission be serviced even sooner if towing or operating mainly in the mountains.

4. The vehicle final drive (rear end) oil should be changed at what interval?

D. 12 Months/12,000 Miles

Do at the same time as transmission.

5. The chassis should be lubricated how often?

D. 3 Months/3,000 Miles

6. The recommended tire pressures are what?

That's our story, if it's of any value to you. Needless to say, we are very pleased with our GMC's performance and its reliability. Also, we are looking forward to a trip on the Alcan Highway, so would you please send us a copy of the Alaskan itinerary described in a recent issue of the GMC TRAVELER?

8. Type oil recommended for the engine is?

A. SE

9. Traction can be increased by doing what?

A. Using snow tires

B. Using tire chains

C. Raising rear of vehicle with air leveling system

Raising the rear of the vehicle throws more weight on front tires, thus increasing traction. This should only be used in low speed, short term situations: such as a steep, slippery entrance drive. *Caution!* Rear suspension height *must* be returned to normal before operating your vehicle at normal driving speeds.
