The basic \$150.00 4-day "rally package", which covers one coach and one couple, includes *all* camping fees, all breakfasts, buffets, bus and boat tours, dinner and dancing at the fabled Del Coronado Hotel, potlucks, service clinics and seminars, and promises to be one of the greatest get-togethers ever shared by GMC Motorhome owners.

Special arrangements were made months ago with San Diego's highly popular DeAnza (Mission Bay) Campland to reserve one entire beachside area of the park for our attending GMC Motorhome Club members and their coaches. A special GMC Club registration and rally tent will be set up

on the Campland grounds and will be in operation to welcome you upon your arrival in San Diego.

Located on the waters of Mission Bay, Campland is Southern California's most complete recreational vehicle facility. It offers a spacious beach, 700 campsites, full hook-ups, fire rings, picnic tables and storage lockers. Some sites even feature stand-up barbecues. Consisting of 42 acres, Campland is virtually a small city in that it has its own on-grounds supermarket, laundromat, restaurant, game room, amphitheater, swimming pool-sauna-Jacuzzi as well as tiled and heated showers and restrooms. In the meantime, drive 'em safely, happy GMCing and we shall see you in San Diego. "ANCHORS AWAY"!

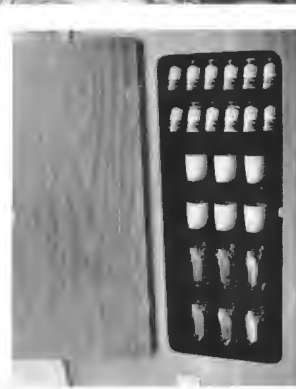

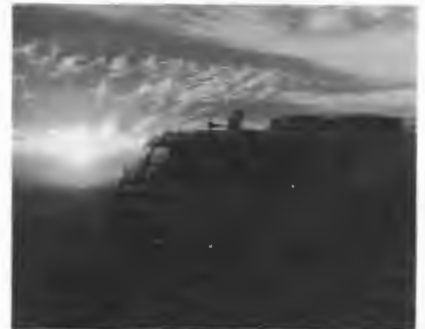

The shore power cable is designed for 40 amps at 240 volts AC. However, there are no 240 VAC loads; therefore, the main AC power distribution breaker box is set up with two 40 amp 120 volt AC main breakers or an 80 amp system. Many new homes are built with only 100 amp capacity systems. If all standard electrical loads are energized at one time, the shore power load would be approximately 55 amps. This is why extreme caution must be used regarding electrical adapters. It is possible to overload a 20 or 30 amp adapter to the extent it generates heat. When this happens, the shore power plug can be damaged by the heat.
